Event Summary

The TARC 2025 team presented the conceptual phase of the project to the KIPDA TPC monthly meeting on August 22. The KIPDA TPC carries out key policy functions and directs the transportation planning process as the board of the Louisville region's Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). An MPO is an agency created by federal law to provide local elected officials input into the planning and implementation of federal transportation funds to metropolitan areas with populations of greater than 50,000. The KIPDA TPC includes elected and appointed leaders from all major jurisdictions and transportation-related agencies in the Louisville region. Presentation included an overview of TARC's financial situation and reasons for launching TARC 2025, the project timeline, and an overview of the three conceptual TARC networks. Questions included:

- What has TARC heard from the community thus far?
- Are there any groups or demographics that TARC has had trouble reaching?
- Where can community members find listings of TARC 2025 public events?

- Is TARC looking into cutting expenses not associated directly with service to preserve more service levels?
- Would TARC have to cut routes again in the future?
- How much would the Jefferson County occupational tax have to increase to fully fund the Growth Concept?
